## Become a partner

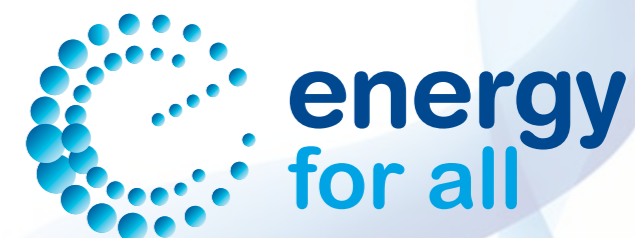

## Meeting the challenge of Energy for All

Efforts to expand access to clean and modern energy for all must continue. Nearly 1 billion people in Asia and the Pacific still do not have access to electricity, and 1.8 billion people still rely on burning wood, dung, and crop waste to meet their cooking and heating needs. This persistent energy poverty hinders progress toward more sustainable and inclusive growth.

There are many good models in place across the region for extending access to reliable and affordable modern energy to poor and rural communities. These include off-grid renewable energy sources, such as solar photovoltaic and micro-hydro; improved cooking technologies, such as efficient stoves and biogas; and innovative approaches in implementing and financing projects. The challenge now is to bring these successful approaches to scale to benefit millions more households.



## A partnership to scale up access to clean, modern energy

Launched in June 2009 at the Asia Clean Energy Forum, the Energy for All Partnership is a regional response to a regional challenge.

The Partnership provides a platform for cooperation, knowledge and technical exchange, innovation, and project development, bringing together key stakeholders from business, financial institutions, governments, and non-government organisations.

The Partnership is focused on action, with a goal to provide access to clean and modern energy to 100 million people in the Asia-Pacific region by 2015 through:

- promoting exchange of knowledge, ideas, and information;
- demonstrating and mainstreaming appropriate financing mechanisms;
- replicating and scaling up proven approaches; and
- building partnerships to develop, finance and implement access to energy projects.

ADB, through its Energy for All Initiative, is supporting the Partnership during its establishment phase.

## A partnership to provide access to energy to 100 million people in Asia and the Pacific by 2015

The Partnership is the outcome of extensive consultation with stakeholders, including two workshops convened in Manila in 2008, and responds to the need for a regional initiative dedicated to scaling up access to energy.

## Working Groups
